



Career Development:


- Email Etiquette/Computer Skills- Student is taught basic email procedures, dos and don'ts of online correspondence and how to access online software.
- Soft Skills/Typing- Student learns what adaptable, transferable, and job skills they have and how to articulate them.
- Resume/Cover letter- Student is able to create a detailed resume that lists their accurate work history, applicable job skills, and proper education.
- Interviewing/Job Search Student is able to articulate the training and skills they have obtained. Student is able to conduct an applicable and through job search to satisfy their career goals.

Nutritional Classes:


Students improve the health of themselves and their families through practical lessons on basic nutrition and healthy lifestyles, food resource management, food safety and physical activity.

- Remerge- Faces of Remerge Luncheon-(1.5 hours)-Single event



Career Readiness Workshops

1st week- Writing Email Workshops and Effective Communication - "Working Lunch" initial check in and follow up with new students to reiterate class rules. Go over Virtual Learning Schedule.

2nd week- Resume/Interview Workshops, InterviewStream. (This workshop will be repeated when student begins Internship and/or job search)

3rd week- Cover Letter Workshops, 1st Resume Draft Due

4th week- 2nd Draft of Resume and Cover Letter Due

5th week- Workplace Conversations Workshops- Confidence Building, Classroom activity.

6th week- Feedback and Criticism Workshops, Dealing with Difficult People.

7th week- Decision Making Skills Workshops- How to find a job and the Labor Market
