

Inside the Library

Sections of the Library:

General Collection Reference

General Collection:

Located in the Southwest quadrant of the Library. The Main section holds the books and audiovisual material that may be checked out.

Reference:

Located in the Northeast quadrant of the Library. Materials in this section may not be checked out. Two self-serve copiers are available (5¢ per page) in the Library for your convenience.

Reference Desk:

Located in the center section of the Library. A Reference Librarian is available to assist you with your research or answer questions you may have about the Library.

Reserve:

The Reserve section is at the Circulation Desk. These materials are placed on Reserve for a limited time by instructors to be checked out and used *on the 4th floor of the Library*.

Dictionary Stand:

Located at the end of the first unit of books in the Reference section. Traditional collegiate dictionaries as well as foreign language, visual, sign language, specialized dictionaries and thesaurus' are found here.

Atlas Stand:

Located at the east end of the Library, near the Library Network.

Periodicals/Newspapers:

Located in the northwest quadrant of the Library. Periodicals and journals are in alphabetical order and date order. Selected current editions are located near the lounge seating next to the stairs.

The Oklahoman and The Wall Street Journal are the daily newspaper subscriptions received in the

Quiet Study Areas:

Library.

There are four Group Study Rooms on the 4th floor of the Library. Room 4 is designated as a 'Collaboration Room' with up-to-date technology available. Two additional rooms are reserved as 'Special Project' rooms and must be accessed by staff. There is also a Quiet Study Area located on the 3rd floor.

Library Network (Research Computers):

Located in the southeast quadrant of the Library. The Internet is available on all the computers in this area. The Library subscribes to several databases for periodical, journal, newspaper articles and government documents for your research. Pete's Portal is a great place to start. Sign in and you can check your personal preferences, look at Library loans you already have, and request items in the Library to be held for you to pick up. Microsoft Word is not available on any of the computers.

Disability Enhanced Computers:

Located by the Circulation Desk. These computers are ideally set up for students with hearing, visual, etc. disabilities.
